

Organization

FEMA is a federal agency within the <u>U.S Department</u> of <u>Homeland Security</u> (DHS). The FEMA administrator reports directly to the DHS Secretary. The administrator also has a direct line of access to the U.S. President during periods of disaster response.

FEMA is comprised of:

- Headquarters in Washington, D.C. where the <u>Office</u> of the <u>Administrator</u> and various <u>program offices</u> are located.
- <u>Ten regional offices</u> that work directly with states, territories and <u>tribes</u>.
- Field offices that manage disaster response and recovery in disaster locations.
- Various warehouses and staging areas throughout the country.


